What is Human Subjects Research?

- Human subjects research is any research or clinical investigation that involves humans (or data or samples traced back to humans) as research subjects.
- Research is a systematic investigation: research development, testing/evaluation, designed to contribute to generalizable knowledge.
- A **systematic investigation** involves a prospective plan that incorporates data collection, either quantitative or qualitative, and data analysis to answer a question.
